Tally Weijl animal welfare policy relies on ethical and responsible standards in the use of animal-related products. Animal products must come from animals that have been treated ethically and responsibly according to the internationally accepted “Five Freedoms” for animal welfare set out by the World Organization by Animal Health (OIE) in their Animal Health Codes and the Farm Animal Welfare Committee (FAWC):

- Freedom from Hunger and Thirst - by ready access to fresh water and a diet to maintain full health and vigour.
- Freedom from Discomfort - by providing an appropriate environment including shelter and a comfortable resting area.
- Freedom from Pain, Injury or Disease - by prevention or rapid diagnosis and treatment.
- Freedom to Express Normal Behaviour - by providing sufficient space, proper facilities and company of the animal's own kind.
- Freedom from Fear and Distress - by ensuring conditions and treatment, which avoid mental suffering.

Tally Weijl is a member and strictly follows the Fur Free Retailer Program supported by the Fur Free Alliance, where animal fur is defined as “any animal skin or part thereof with hair or fur fibers attached thereto, either in its raw or processed state or the pelt of any animal killed solely for its fur”. We never use products from animal slaughtered exclusively for their skin, shell, horn, bone, feather or down, and we may only use animal raw materials that come from animals used for meat production.

Tally Weijl supply chain accepts and undersigns this policy and are committed to provide all relevant information needed about the origin and compliance on all animal origin materials, and do not use endangered and vulnerable species*.

*As defined by CITES (Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species), and the IUCN (International Union for Conservation of Nature) Red List of Critically endangered; or Vulnerable listed species.
